



# Altarnun Primary School - Uniform



We strongly believe that school uniform gives our pupils a sense of identity and of belonging to the school. It helps to ensure that no child feels disadvantaged in terms of appearance, removes the need to keep up with constantly changing and expensive fashion trends, and instils a sense of pride. We expect all our school pupils to wear full school uniform and come to school looking presentable



## Our school uniform:

### Autumn & Spring Term Uniform:

- **APS sweatshirt / cardigan**
- **White shirt / polo shirt (long or short sleeved)**
- **Black trousers, shorts, pinafore or skirts**
- **Black, safe, comfortable shoes (not trainers or boots)**
- **Plain grey or black tights, plain white, black or grey socks**
- **APS Sun Cap**

### Summer Term Uniform (as above plus):

- **Blue and white checked dresses (with white socks only – no tights)**

We provide the following compulsory items to pupils when they start school (**replacements ordered through the school office**)

- **APS Book Bag**
- **APS Water bottle**

## For PE your child will need

1. A pair of **black** shorts, and/or **black** jogging bottoms, and/or **black** leggings
2. An 'APS logo' Sports T-shirt
3. A pair of **black** plimsolls and/or **black** trainers (no studded football boots)
4. A black hoody
5. Items named in a drawstring PE Bag

## For Forest Schools & outdoor learning:

Old clothes with long sleeves and legs covered, long hair tied back, waterproofs when necessary, outdoor shoes/boots or wellies (need to be labelled)

## How to order uniform:

Items highlighted in blue above are compulsory purchases through the school office on 01566 700700.

The remaining items can be purchased from any shop e.g. Tesco, M&S etc.

## All clothing and belongings need to be named so we can easily return anything that is lost.

We ask that children do not wear jewellery of any kind except for small studs (if ears are pierced), or wear nail varnish, makeup or tattoos. For health and safety reasons, long hair should be kept out of children's eyes and tied back, particularly for PE and Forest School sessions. Hair accessories should be plain and in school colours (blue, grey or black). Extreme hairstyles such as very short or 'buzz cuts', sculptured names or symbols, or dyed hair, are neither appropriate nor acceptable for children of primary school age.
